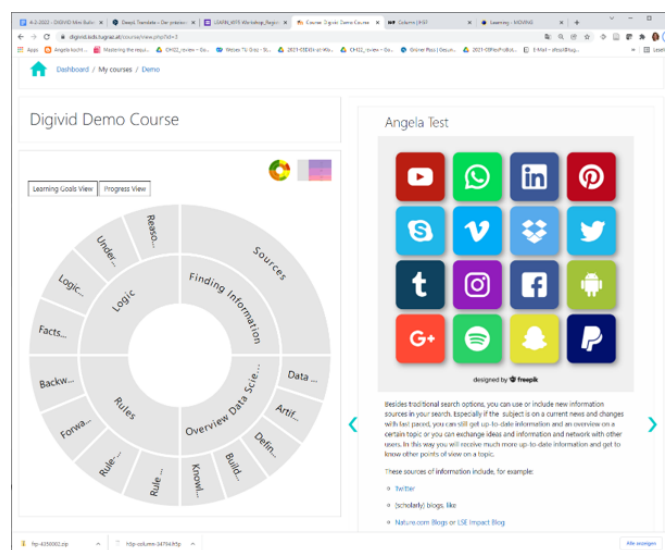
### DIGIVID News

#### DIGIVID Workshop (18.11.2021) with Associates Partners

Our second DIGIVID Workshop took place on the 18th of November from 11:00 - 13:00. In this workshop, we successfully discussed with two of our Associated Partners the five modules of our DIGIVID Curriculum. We received valuable feedback about important factors for teacher education such as (i) offering support for teachers for the acquisition of basic digital competences, (ii) highlight the role of digital media in the society - especially during the CoVid-19 pandemic and (iii) make copyright and data protection clear in the development of tools and content as this could be a stumbling block!

#### DIGIVIDget

We have implemented a first version of the DIGIVIDget prototype on Moodle. This prototype now includes the two DIGIVID visualizations as well as the easy-to-use micro learning content - as presented in the screenshot below.

## DIGIVID ForeCast

### DIGIVID Workshop (22.2.2022) with pre-service teachers

We are currently preparing a workshop with pre-service teachers to discuss the topics and learning goals of the DIGIVID Curriculum in detail. In module 1, we deal with basic digital competences, while module 2 focuses on the societal impact caused by the usage of technology as key media for teaching and learning. Modul 3 is dealing with the design of digital learning and teaching materials, and modul 4 is emphasizing on how to teach and learn with digital media in practice. In the workshop, we would like to investigate if the currently developed DIGIVID topics and learning goals are useful and if there are topics or learning goals that could be removed or enhanced. Additionally, we will ask the participants if they have suggestions for further relevant topics.

After the workshop with pre-service teachers, we plan to repeat this workshop with in-service teachers in March. We will get in contact with you and ask you for help to promote this workshop or to directly invite interested in-service teachers, who would like to take part in these discussions..
